Brechin Castle Show Rules

It is assumed that ALL competitors have read these conditions and hereby agree to abide by them!

Due to the recent outbreak of Equine Flu, only ponies/horses with up to date vaccinations will be allowed to enter the Spring Show. Please do NOT bring unvaccinated horses to Brechin Castle Showground. Passports with vaccination records must accompany horses and should be available for spot checks. If your horse is showing any symptoms please leave him at home and do NOT bring any horses from the same yard. Please do not touch any other horses and do not let your horse have any contact with other horses.

- Riding hats showing the BSI Kitemark with codes PAS 015, VG1, SNELL 2001 and secure chin straps must be worn at all times with the exception of adults entering the Side Saddle class who may wear appropriate Side Saddle headgear at their own risk.
- Whips must not exceed 30" in length with the exception of whips used in the Side Saddle class which may be 1m long
- Stallions may not be ridden or led by juniors under the age of 14 years.
- Entries will be accepted on the day and only postal or online entries that arrive before the closing date will be accepted.
- The Organisers reserve the right to cancel or amalgamate classes in the event of insufficient entries.
- Competitors are asked to note the timetable and the appropriate ring. Where a horse/pony is entered into more than one class, the Organiser takes no responsibility if a clash in time occurs. No refunds will be given in any circumstances, however the class fee may be transferred at the discretion of the Secretary and Organiser.
- The classes will be announced on the PA system on the day, however it is the competitors' reponsibility to be at the correct ring in time for their class starting. The Organisers take no responsibility for classes missed by competitors!
- For health and safety reasons, no earrings or body piercing may be worn by competitors.
- The Judge's decision is final in matters of appeal or complaint by competitors. Objections must be lodged in writing with the Secretary within no more than one hour of an incident. A deposit of £30.00 must be paid which will be forfeited if the complaint is overruled. The decision of the Organiser is final.
- All dogs must be kept on leads at all times. The owner will be fined £20.00 for immediate payment if a dog is found loose on the s/field
- Exhibitors must ensure that horses/ponies are kept under control at all times.
- It is a requirement that all exhibitors have Public Liability Insurance.

Blair Castle Working Hunter Pony Series 2019

- 1a/b Ponies may only qualify once for each NPS Scotland Competition Final. Ponies that take a 2nd qualifier for the same section will be disqualified from entering the final.
- 1c It is the responsibilty of the exhibitor to ensure that their jockey/handler is aware of their pony's qualification status
- 2. All Mountain & Moorland Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective stud book. Part bred, X registered ponies ponies in the appendices of their main stud book and Eriskays are not eligible.
- 3. Qualification in the M & M In Hand Section may go to Champion, Reserve Champion and 1st Reserve Champion. This excludes the NPS Scotland Spring and Summer Shows where 1st and 2nd prize winners will qualify. Qualifications for M&M Novice, Open, WHP, Lead Rein, First Ridden and Riding Pony/Hunter pony classes may go no lower than 4th place.
- 4. A Judge is not obliged to award an NPS Scotland Finals qualification if he/she feels that the pony is not of a sufficient standard
- 5. Cavesson nosebands are the only nosebands permitted in flat ridden classes.
- 6. NPS Scotland Kilmannan Novice Ridden. Ponies can compete as novices in this competition for two consecutive years provided they do not submit an entry to the final in the first year.
- 7. Entries will only be accepted via our on-line entry system, Entry Master. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to keep the qualification card safe as it is essential to complete your entry. Paper entries will not be accepted.
- 8. Closing date for entries. Wednesday 31st July 2019 for all shows prior to that date. Shows from 1st- 5th August, the closing date is 8th August. Please refer to NPS Scotland website for directions on How to submit your entry, on the Entry Master
- 9. The <u>OWNER</u> must be or become a member of NPS Scotland before entering the Finals
- 10. All ridden ponies must be shown off the Lead Rein except in the specified Lead Rein Qualifier Class
- 11. In Mountain & Moorland classes, rider of stallions must be 12 years old or over when riding small breeds (Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh A & B). For large breeds (Highland, Fell, Dales, Connemara, New Forest, Welsh C & D) riders of stallions must be 14 years old or over.
- 12. A child must have attained their 12th birthday as of the 1st January in the current year to either strip or lunge a pony at a NPS Show, except for stallions where age will be the same as in the Rule Book to ride a stallion.
- 13. Handlers of stallions or colts must be 14 years old or over.
- 14. Handlers of ponies in In Hand classes age 14 years and under, must wear a correctly secured skull cap or/ riding hat that meets the current standards.
- 15. The Final will take place at Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 23rd August 2019

Qualification Information

• Veteran Horse Society Scottish Qualifier 2019 This is a qualifier for the Veteran Horse Society Supreme Final: Scottish Veteran Horse of the Year 2019. Kindly sponsored by Allen & Page. Each VHS affiliation in Scotland now holds a PRE - QUAL Supreme Final qualification. Open to members and non members. VHS Scottish Supreme (Pre Judging) Final Qualification: Only Members may qualify. Qualification is given to the highest placed VHS Member in each age category no lower than 3rd place. VHS Show Registration Card is to be produced and handed to the judge in the ring as verification of the qualification. VHS Membership to be applied for no later than 1 week prior to this show, to avoid disappointment.

All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS 2019 Rule Book in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

Mountain and Moorland: The highest placed member in each age category exhibiting an M&M will receive entry to the Pre Judging of the Mountain & Moorland Supreme Final. This may be carried down to 4th place. To be registered with a Breed Society and hold a current Breed Society passport. Show Registration card to be signed by the Judge in the ring.

New for 2019 Young Rider & Handler Championship Qualification: A Young Rider and/or Handler qualification will be awarded to the YR/H of the Judge's choice in each age category, aged 7 - 14years entitling them to enter the Young Rider/Handler Championship prior to the Supreme Final. This award is given at the Judge's discretion. Non Members to receive an Orange card.

Traditional Gypsy Cob Association. Show Number must be written on qualification card by competitors: 19/2505/3/ULT Breed classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the TGCA National Breed at the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association TGCA Championship Show "TOYS". Classes are open to all traditional gypsy cobs. Competitors do not need to know the breeding of their cob, but they must meet breed standards to enter the class.

Stallions - All stallions (4 years and over) in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class **MUST** be be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA evaluations and their TGCA Stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over the age of two **MUST** be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA Rule Book.

Existing TGCA Members that qualify **MUST** present their qualification card to the Judge in the ring and **MUST** have already completed the cob's name and registration prior to the Judge signing. Non members that qualify **MUST** receive a qualification card from the Judge in the ring and have 21 days to join the TGCA and register their horse to validate the qualification. Please refer to **www.tgca.co.uk** for further details including membership, horse registration and showing rules (contained in the members handbook)

TGCA Quest for a Star Championship: The top 3 in class 50 (Youngstock) qualify, and the top 3 Seniors not exceeding 148cms, AND the top 3 seniors over 148cms qualify from classes 51 & 52, and may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship provided they are current TGCA members and the horse is TGCA registered. Membership cards and qualification cards (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS. TGCA Go For Glory In Hand & Ridden: The top 3 in class 53 (Youngstock) qualify and the top 3 seniors not exceeding 148 cm AND the top 3 seniors over 148cms qualify from classes 54 & 55 and may go forward to the TGCA Part Bred Go For Glory Championship. For 2018 & 2019 TOYS qualifiers, the handler/rider & exhibits (apart from stallions) do not have to be TGCA Members/registered on the date of the show. The Champion & Reserve qualify for the Crowning Glory Championships at TOYS.

This show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK), Affiliation Number 19084. Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However in order to qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and present their valid qualifier card IN THE RING for signing by the Judge. Members to apply in writing to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card. The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 28th - 31st August 2019. Shows held on or after the Postal Entry closing date of Championship Show will count as 2020 qualifiers. The following classes are CHAPS(UK) qualifiers: Classes 38 - 41, 44- 48. For full rulings and information on competition/ qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members Handbook or visit www.chapsuk.com for rulings. Only Skewbalds/Piebalds may compete in these classes. All stallions 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS(UK). All stallions must wear Stallion ID discs in the ring without exception

Qualification Information

- Blair Castle Working Hunter Pony Series: Ponies placed 1st to 4th in the qualifying classes will qualify for the Championships held at Blair Castle International Horse Trials and Country fair on Thursday 22nd August 2019. Qualification may go down to 6th place if higher placed ponies have already qualified.
- This show is a qualifier for: The Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR) Series open to Thoroughbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored providing the horse is sound. Riders must be 14 years plus. Ridden horses must be 4 years plus and Veterans are 12 years plus. Judges will not ride and you will not be asked to gallop as a ride but may be asked to gallop in your individual show. To qualify for the Championships at the Grand Slam, Ingliston EC in September 2019, the handler/rider AND horse must be registered with HCR, you must carry their cards in the ring for signing, and be placed 1st 4th (qualifications may be passed down to 6th place) Non members must send their qualification cards (presented by the judge), fees and reguster with HCR no later than 14 days after this show and before the closing date for entries to the Grand Slam.
- This show is a qualifier for : The Clydesdale Horse Society Young Handler. The qualifier will be eligible to compete in the final a at the Royal Highland Show in 2019. Full details can be found in the Clydesdale Horse section.
- This show is a qualifier for: <u>Bidwells Blair Castle Ridden Clydesdale Series</u>: To be judged as a Ridden Hunter class. This class is a qualifier for the <u>Blair Castle International Horse Trials & Country Fair</u> on Sunday 25th Aug 2019. The first two Ridden Clydesdales qualify. Qualification may go down to fourth place, if horses placed 1st and 2nd have previously qualified. Registered Clydesdales and those eligible for registration may qualify and enter for the Championship. To be run under Clydesdale Society rules.
- The Side Saddle Association qualifying details are printed on page 10 and will be held in Ring 4.
- <u>TSR Showing Finals</u> This show is a qualifier for the TSR Showing Finals. Qualify and enter ANY of the finals Central, East Anglia, North West, North East, South East, South, Wales & South West or Scottish. You do not have to be a TSR member to qualify or enter a final. The Rider/ Handler qualifies and can enter any horse/pony in any number of finals.

TSR Riders Finals - 1st & 2nd riders qualify and will receive a qualification card in the ring.

TSR In Hand Finals - The two highest placed handlers with a TSR In Hand card will qualify in any In Hand class. Handlers MUST have their cards signed in the ring by the Judge/steward. Cards are available free from the TSR website www.theshowingregister.co.uk/
TSR Medal Awards - TSR members can collect qualification cards and signatures and redeem for a TSR medal.see TSR website for details

BSHA Grass Roots Champs & SHGB BRC Champs. With a TSR qualification flyer you can also enter the BSHA Grass Roots Champs on 9th Sept at Addington Equestrian Centre. You do not have to be a BSHA member to qualify oe enter the final.

Evening performances, loads of bling and razzamatazz! Everything an end of season Championship should have! This year's Championship Show will be held at Highfield of Howe, near Fife on 12/13thOctober 2019. This show is a qualifier and every horse & pony placed 1st and 2nd in all In Hand and Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) will qualify in any appropriate class at the Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring and no qualification can go down the line. Qualification is for the Horse & Pony except for Adult/Young Handler classes where the Handler qualifies. All qualified horses and ponies will be listed on the Caledonian Showing Show's website www.caledonianchampionships.webs.com where you will find a regular updated list of qualifying shows
- This show is affiliated to **Festival Scotland 2019**. Qualification card entitles the competitor to enter all classes at both the Scotland and England Summer Championships in 2019. The top 3, not already qualified within the top 6 placings will receive a qualification card For further information visit: www.festivalofchampions.co.uk or join our Facebook page.

NPS Scotland/ Kilgraston School M&M Lead Rein Championship

The 2 highest placed ponies in the Lead Rein class 16 not already qualified will go forward to the final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 23rd August 2019. Qualifications will go no lower than 4th place Class 12 M&M Lead Rein Mare or gelding 4 years and over not exceeding 122cms 12hh

Riders must be at least 3 years old on the day of the class and not to have attained their 9th birthday by the 1st Jan in the current year. Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bridle with lead rein attached to noseband only. Ponies may not be ridden side saddle. Handles on saddles are permitted. Ponies must NOT be cantered. The owner does not have to be an NPS Scotland member for the pony to enter the competition but they must become a Member to enter the finals.

NPS Scotland/ Kilgraston School M&M First Ridden Championship

The 2 highest placed ponies in the Lead Rein class 17 not already qualified will go forward to the final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 23rd August 2019. Qualifications will go no lower than 4th place Class 13 M&M First Ridden Mare or gelding 4 years and over not exceeding 128cms 12.2hh Riders not to have reached their 12th birthday by 1st January in the current year. The owner does not have to be a NPS Scotland member for the pony to enter this competition, but the owner must become a member to enter the final. Ponies must not be cantered except in their individual show. Ponies will not be stripped and may be shown in any suitable bridle. Ponies may not be ridden side saddle.

NPS Scotland/Kilmannan Stud Novice Ridden Mountain & Moorland Championship

The 2 highest placed ponies, **not already qualified** in classes 18 -20 will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Blair International Horse trials on Friday 23rd August 2019. **Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.** This can be either mixed M&M or Breed Classes. Rider any age except stallions (see rules) Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit.

A minimum of 6 ponies must be stripped in qualifying rounds . All ponies must be stripped in the NPS finals.

Class 14 Novice Ridden Registered Small Breeds 4 years old and over. Stallion, mare or gelding
Class 15 Novice Ridden Registered Large Breeds 4 years old and over. Stallion, mare or gelding
Class 16 Novice Ridden Registered Highland Ponies 4 years old and over. Stallion, mare or gelding
